#### **Great Expectations**

Revd Chris Brown writes that even in times of darkness, God does not turn away from us, and in Advent, as we prepare to celebrate the coming of Jesus, there is a promise of light.

Dear friends,

As I sit writing this letter to you all I am reminded by the weather of how the seasons progress through our lives. Last night we put our clocks back an hour, rising this morning in expectation of a light and bright morning. But no, it was dark and dismal until ten thirtyish. All of a sudden the sun shone brightly through the church windows dazzling everyone inside. All this helped me to focus on this December letter. As we approach the celebration of the arrival of the Christ child into our world, and probably more importantly into our lives, we spend Advent preparing ourselves to greet Christ.

In preparing any letter or talk about Jesus I always try to place myself in his time so that I can attempt to understand something of what he was talking about, in the context of the world as it was then. How would the people of Jesus' time have seen today? Would they have been able to comprehend the freedom we have? Would changing the hour on the clocks make them smile and say "you cannot change the weather or the happenings of the seasons"? Could they take on board the busyness of our lives?



As the people struggled under the weight of the Roman occupation the promise from the Prophets of better things to come must have seemed like a bright beacon before their eyes something to look forward to, a promise of freedom, a promise of light and the fulfilment of God's covenant with his people.

When you read this letter will we be in similar circumstances? Listening

to the experts on the news and in the papers it would appear we are heading for a time of severe shortages. With the aftereffects of the pandemic still hovering over us, are we in a similar position to the people of Jesus' time? The threat of another lockdown looming over us. The rising numbers of infections. Seeing the nurses and doctors straining to cope.

The times of darkness seem to be all about us, but, as Pip says in Dickens'

novel, we have "great expectations" in the fact that God has never ever turned away from us and always pours out his unconditional love on us all the time, in the sending of his Son, Jesus, born in a dark and oppressed time, in a dark and dismal stable to bring us all hope and love, not just over the Christmas period but in all our lives.



## MARCHINGTON PARISH COUNCIL

#### **Chairman's Report for December 2021**

Once again we enter the Christmas period and my favourite time of year in our wonderful parish. It's a great place to live and it's smashing to see new residents getting involved in lots of activities around the parish.

In October we had an excellent meeting with Clare Pearson, the Prison Director of Dovegate, and we agreed that liaising with ourselves and with Draycott parish was very positive. Having reported about the donated planters last month we have also engaged the prison to make items for sale in our Marchington Community Shop, which I think is a great initiative. So planters and some festive wreaths are available, but the bird boxes need a bit more work on them.

In November, at long last, a lot of work was done to improve the road surface of Green Lane, and whilst it's not like the A50, it is a vast improvement. It's taken many years of Parish Councillors' efforts to get to this point. It makes getting to the Community Orchard less stressful and that remains a place well worth a visit. A new willow arbour will be built here next year, which will further enhance the natural beauty of this secluded place.

With reference to flooding, the Environment Agency informed us they are continuing to work on the village infrastructure to help alleviate damage during and after flooding events. In addition, the County Council finally signed off the authority for us to close roads in a flooding event. This is really important as it means that our village flood wardens have a chance to reduce damage to property and perhaps protect people for the very real dangers that can occur during a flood.

Around the village the volunteers continue to do their good works, pick ing up litter, planting bulbs and generally keeping the village looking good. In the Woodlands, the Village Hall Committee held a very successful Bonfire Party, and on Forestside we continue to look for solutions to the problems of the garages area.

As I said earlier, it's a great time of year for a lot of people so may I wish you all a very merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.

# Marchington Woodlands Village Hall Update and 2021 AGM



Only days before November  $5_{th}$ , the traditional Bonfire Night and Fireworks event was in serious doubt. The safety conditions imposed by the hall's insurance underwriter were far too demanding for a small venue like the Village Hall. The Committee looked for an alternative location to set off the fireworks, that was well away from spectators and neighbouring property. The Charlesworth family kindly agreed to let the Committee use their field, opposite the Village Hall land. With this new firework site and a smaller bonfire in the hall field, another insurance company covered the event, although it came at a price.

The immediate crisis was averted but there was little time to get everything organised, including publicity. Conversations took place with Rhoda and Mike about having a separate poster for the event, as the November Parish News print-run had been missed. Mike and the Team did the Village Hall a big favour by distributing posters with the magazines.

Then came the small matter of the fireworks. Firework costs have risen enormously since 2019 (the last Bonfire Night event) and it meant another big expense. The Committee decided to bite the bullet. There have been fireworks at the Village Hall on November  $5_{th}$  for a great many years and the Committee didn't want to be the one to end the tradition.





The weather was kind on Bonfire Night and the number of people who turned up at the Village Hall exceeded all expectations. Using the land opposite didn't seem to lessen the spectators' enjoyment and the team setting off the fireworks were pleased to hear the round of applause at the end of the display. Things seem to have worked out well in the end.

The Chairman thanked Committee members for their work during the year and acknowledged the success of the August Summer Dance.

The Village Hall Accounts prepared to 28 February 2021 were accepted and signed.

Committee members/Trustees were appointed until the next AGM. Judy Slaney resigned as Secretary and was thanked for all her hard work during her ten years in the role.
