## Area letter from Revd Jules Walker

Dear friends,

Every year in November, the village in which I lived as a child, held a firework party on the community playing fields. We would all wrap up warm in woolly hats, scarves and mittens (I remember it being much colder back then!) and drink tomato soup from polystyrene cups. Then, we would watch the huge bonfire and feel its heat before the highlight of the night, the firework display. In reality, I'm sure the rockets and roman candles weren't very impressive, but they were enough to spark in me a lifelong love of fireworks and bonfire night.

I have been to many 5th November firework displays since but none quite compares to the live, silent, extravaganza of whizzes and bangs on the breakfast Radio Two program of the late, wonderful, Sir Terry Wogan. Perhaps you remember it too? He would describe passionately every sparkle, flash and tumbling cascade of colour going through his head. In an article for the Telegraph in 2011 reflecting on the shows Wogan commented "There were begrudgers who complained about the lack of parking and toilet facilities, and burnt-out fireworks on the carpet around the radio, but I like to think that there are some who remember, with a sigh, the solace of fireworks on the wireless". Funny, the things we remember!

The Christian faith is a "remembering" faith. Every week as we break bread and drink wine together we follow Jesus instruction to "do this in remembrance of me." (Luke 22:19) We remember that God has made himself near to us. And in November we add to our remembering. From

All Saints Day (1<sup>st</sup> Nov) to the first Sunday of Advent (27<sup>th</sup> Nov) we look back over our history as Christians and as a country and reflect on the lessons the past can teach us. We are inspired by the lives of the saints and humbled by the sacrifice of those who gave their lives that we might be free. More specifically, our annual “Remembering Services” this year sneaking into some churches on October 30<sup>th</sup> may give us the space to bring our memories of those we love that have died, to God. In the longer hours of darkness and in the absence of the sun’s warmth we have a place to stop, light a candle, wrap up warm and remember. Our Remembrance Day Sunday services on November 13<sup>th</sup> might also hold more poignancy this year as we remember back to the pageantry displayed by our Armed Services during our late Queen’s funeral parades. Remembering is so important and what better way than to remember with others.

God our Father

As we remember those who have gone before us this November  
Give us the comfort of knowing that they have gone only as far as you  
and you are very near. Amen

## Nature Notes

Friends of Marchington have had a couple of industrious days in the community orchard recently. We have cleared more of the nettles in front of the buddy bench, to extend the size of the wildflower area, which now reaches almost to the brook. After much digging. Spring bulbs were planted, followed by a good sprinkling of 'Perfect for Pollinators' wildflower seeds, kindly donated by Les Tench. The mix contains 27 different flower species. Many are perennial, so will last a lot longer than the annuals. We look forward to see it blooming in 2023. We aim also, to create a similar area in front of the living willow arbour too.

We finished off our work sessions, with some serious apple picking. A tall fruit picking ladder, helped us reach the highest yielding branches and created a lovely pastoral scene, akin to something out of a Robert Hardy novel! Everyone traipsed home, rosy cheeked, carrying a bag of booty. Thank you F of M. You are all stars.

***For anyone wishing to watch an expert at work. We have booked Jeff Bates, to prune some of our fruit trees in the orchard on Monday 12 December. (Weather permitting) Anyone is welcome to join in and watch.***

## Barn Owls

At least two owlets fledged the nest in September. They were seen regularly practicing flight, flapping their wings on the platform, whilst mum and dad were kept fully employed searching for voles to keep them fed. This, 'if you build it, they will come' approach, works in many of our projects. And long may it continue, as these havens are needed for our ever pressured natural world.

## Hall Road Stall.

The stall has had another great year, supplying preserves, vegetables, fruit and flowers. We have amassed over £1000, selling this produce. Thank you to all our producers, including Pat Gillespie for her delicious marmalade and legendary strawberry jam. My allotment buddies, who

throw their excess vegetables my way. Anne Mathews, who chips in with her Chucky eggs. Nick Bagshaw's juicy pears And all of our generous customers. We couldn't do it without you. These funds, will be purchasing bulbs, trees and plants and generally give nature a hand.

## **MARCHINGTON PARISH COUNCIL – CHAIRMAN'S REPORT NOVEMBER 2022**

The re-arranged September Parish Council meeting took place on 27<sup>th</sup> September after the period of mourning for the Queen. There was a full agenda and this resulted in a long meeting including a discussion with the new management of the Smallwood Manor Hospital team.

### **Smallwood Manor Hospital**

The PC meeting was an opportune time for councillors and residents to ask questions about the operation of the hospital by Cove Healthcare which is due to open in November 2022 for the lower two tiers of mental health. The hospital will be an in-patient young adult and

children's mental health service for children from 10 to 18 years and adults up to 25 years.

The management team outlined the set-up emphasising that the character of the building will not be altered and that the sports field and swimming pool will be preserved and used. There will be an application for the diversion of a public footpath which runs through the grounds.

### **Church Lane Sewer**

Through traffic and residents in Marchington were disrupted for nearly two weeks in the latter part of September by Severn Trent road works in Church Lane to alter the curvature of the flow of the sewer. The original estimate had been a road closure of one to two days. It is hoped these works will reduce the occurrence of sewage spillages through manholes in Church Lane. The next periods of flooding will be the test.

### **Flood Management**

The Parish Council is extremely frustrated with the situation with the Environment Agency flood protection plans, particularly the re-enforcement of the bund at the rear of Church Close. There is a feeling of going round in circles and we are now back in Autumn with no ground works done and the wet season upon us. We have had drought conditions for a number of months this Summer which would have been ideal for ground works.

### **Woodlands Chapel Triangle**

There is still no change with the current situation with the Chapel Triangle in that the issues are with the legal department of Staffordshire County Council.

### **Travellers**

The traditional travellers have now moved away from Marchington to Abbots Bromley and have left minimal mess and disruption to residents.

### **Parish Council Meetings**

It was decided that the October PC meeting would take place as usual in Marchington Village Hall but the November PC meeting would take place in Marchington Woodlands Village Hall to avoid disturbance from MADS rehearsals for the performance of Oliver . I hope you have bought your tickets .







Her Majesty was a great advocate for the breed; she had breeding herds based at Sandringham, Windsor and Balmoral and in her later years she only rode a Fell Pony, quite often her beloved Carltonima Emma. (Emma was seen at Windsor castle with one of the Queen's headscarves, as her majesty's cortege (passed by)

The Duke of Edinburgh also had a passion for Fell Ponies; he competed for many years at National level in The Pony Teams class with a four in hand of Fells. The Fell Pony Society remembers him for presenting the Duke of Edinburgh Award which is given internationally each year for Fell ponies in harness.

Her Majesty's knowledge and passion for all horse and pony breeds is what will remain in our hearts and memories. We are proud that our Fell ponies have been associated for so long with royalty Fells are strong and clever. They'll have a go at anything you're brave enough to try. All the historic qualities that Fell Ponies have had down the ages, are still useful today. They say once you have had a Fell Pony you never look back, they're intelligent, funny and kind. Fell ponies are known for their versatility and longevity. The strength of the Fell pony and the lovely community that comes with owning this fabulous breed is demonstrated today by our actions up and down the country acknowledging Her Majesty and providing support to each other at this time.
